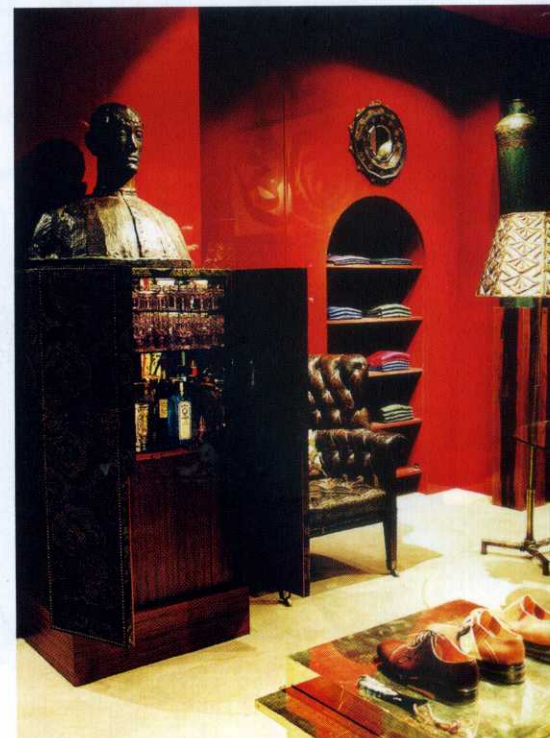


▲ LARS BOLANDER NY, NEW YORK CITY

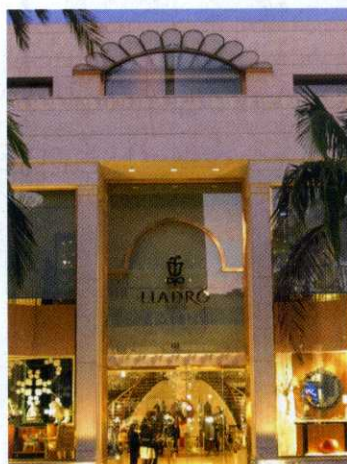
